You'll probably work in a number of different occupations over the course of your working life. The good news? Many of the skills and abilities developed working in one occupation are directly transferable and applicable to others. The Job Outlook website has information on hundreds of different occupations. They also offer job descriptions and details of average wages and main tasks. By exploring the website, you can get a sense of the kind of work that might suit you. Australian Government: Disability Employment Services

The Australian Government Services Australia's Disability Employment Services (DES) can help you find and keep a job if you have a disability. DES providers can help you gain the job-ready and job-seeking skills you may need. If necessary, they can also provide support once you are in a job. Educational Access Scheme for QTAC applicants

Students with a disability are strongly encouraged to apply for the Educational Access Scheme (EAS) when applying for tertiary courses through QTAC. You may be eligible to receive Adjustment Factors that will improve your chance of receiving a course offer. It is not too late to apply for EAS if you have already put in your QTAC application. Visit the Educational Access Scheme on the QTAC website to download the relevant cover sheet (or sheets). Complete the cover sheet and upload your supporting documents to your QTAC application (by going to 'Outstanding Documents'). The final date to submit your EAS application for the offer-rounds on 21 December 2023 is 7 December and for 11 January 2024, 8 December 2024. Visit Key dates and fees page for offer round dates. QTAC recommends that current Year 12 students submit their application by the end of October, so additional information can be accessed from your school if necessary.

Studying at QUT with a disability, injury or health condition


Do you have a summer job?



Need to write a cover letter?

One-page, ultra-long cover letters are a thing of the past. Jean Chatzky from Her Money writes that employers want to get to know your motivations, but no one wants to read more than a half page. Essentially, the new cover letter is a lot shorter and should also be sweeter, meaning that it has to show more personality. Take, for example, the character length of a Facebook post versus a Tweet. One has an unlimited number of characters (63,206, to be exact), while the other has just 280 characters. But a Tweet's limited character count inspires us to condense all the most important information and make sure our words pack a punch. 





Deadline for written statement and online assessment requirements for education courses

If you are applying for entry into tertiary education courses for 2024, you must submit written statements and complete an online questionnaire to address your suitability criteria for the course. These form part of your QTAC application. These statements must be submitted before the QTAC documentation due dates (see Page 18 in your QTAC Guide or Key dates on the QTAC website). You must have submitted your statements by 7 December 2023 for the 21 December 2023 offer round





and the 8 December 2023 for the 11 January 2024 offer round. Visit the <u>QTAC website</u> to view a Fact Sheet explaining what is required in the written statements.

Pathways to university study

While an ATAR is still the most popular pathway to gaining entry to your preferred university course, it is not the only pathway available in Queensland. If you don't achieve your university course goal straight after Year 12, it is not the end of the road. There are many upgrading pathways available to you. Several tertiary institutions have web pages dedicated to the alternative pathways to tertiary studies.

Some QTAC Q&As

- Q. I applied for the Educational Access Scheme (EAS) when I applied to QTAC. What do I need to do now?
- **A.** If you didn't download an Educational Access Scheme cover sheet/s for the category/categories you are applying for, <u>click here</u>, scroll down to cover sheets, then click on the relevant EAS category. The cover sheet/sheets provide a list of all documentation that you will need to submit to QTAC by the <u>due date</u>.
- Q. I didn't apply for the Educational Access Scheme (EAS) when I applied to QTAC. Can I still apply for EAS?
- **A.** Yes. You can go back into your application and apply for EAS. Then you need to download the relevant cover sheet (or sheets) from the <u>EAS page</u> on the QTAC website. Complete all the requirements listed on the cover sheet. Attach any required supporting documents by uploading to your QTAC application or post your completed EAS application to QTAC. Some cover sheets may require a school statement. QTAC would like Year 12 students to submit their EAS applications by the end of October.
- Q. I am totally confused about offer rounds. According to the 2024 Year 12 Guide, the offer-round for my courses is 11 January 2024. Now I hear that I could get an earlier offer.







- **A.** Institutions can give offers to eligible applicants (i.e., applicants who have met all the entry requirements) at different times. Visit the <u>Course Offer Dates</u> page on the QTAC website for dates when institutions might give offers. Offers will be made on all offer-round dates. It is essential that you keep checking your emails as this is how QTAC will let you know you have an offer (don't forget to check your Spam or Junk box!). This is critical as you must respond to an offer by the due date (often within 4 days) or your offer will lapse and you will not be considered for any other courses in future offer rounds.
- Q. I applied for a university course that requires an audition but didn't do the audition. Will I still be considered for entry to this course?
- **A.** You should contact the university. However, the answer will probably be 'No'.
- Q. I am not sure what my ATAR will be. The Pathways (preferences 5 and 6) courses on my QTAC application have previous minimum thresholds of ATAR 78. Is this a good enough safety net?
- **A.** No. It is advisable to select pathways courses (especially your 6th preference) which indicate that all applicants received an offer in 2023. Remember, you can always go back into your QTAC application AFTER you receive your ATAR and make any changes to your preferences that will see you competitive in gaining a place in a course in 2024.
- Q. Where can I get help with my QTAC application after I leave school?
- **A.** Your best source of help at that time of the year is <u>QTAC</u>. You can ring QTAC on 1300 467 822 or email QTAC. You may want to email as the QTAC phone is very busy at this time of year and you need to be patient as you will be on a queue.

Update on Lowest ATAR/Rank offered Semester 1 2023 for courses in 2024

A reminder that when you are looking at the Lowest ATAR/Rank offered Semester 1 2023 for the course/s you are interested in, you should be referring to the ADJUSTED ATAR only. There have been some differences in the Lowest ATAR/Rank offered Semester 1 2023 recorded in the 2024 QTAC Guide and what is on the Universities website. Regarding the Lowest ATAR/Rank offered Semester 1 2023, we suggest that you ALWAYS go by what is on the University website.







5 tips to help you cope with stress

Although a moderate amount of stress in our lives is manageable, excess stress doesn't get you anywhere positive. The article provides you with some tips to manage your stress in a healthy way such as:

- 1. Get some sleep
- 2. Focus on your strengths
- 3. Do things that make you happy
- 4. Engage in physical activity
- 5. Talk to someone

Am I stressed?

<u>Healthdirect</u> has put together a list of body, mind and behavioural stress symptoms. Knowing what to look for and getting on top of your stress can make your life manageable, successful and happy. Some of the signs of stress that they identify are:

Body The symptoms of stress and changes with your body that you may notice include:

- <u>headaches</u>
- other aches and pains
- sleep disturbance
- fatigue
- upset stomach, <u>diarrhoea</u>
- muscle tension

Mind The symptoms of stress affecting your mind, thoughts and feelings include:







- anxiety, worry
- anger, irritability
- <u>depression</u> or sadness
- feeling overwhelmed and out of control
- · feeling restless
- feeling moody, tearful
- difficulty concentrating
- low self-esteem, lack of confidence

Behaviour The symptoms of stress that impact your behaviour include:

- overeating or undereating
- outbursts of anger
- relationship problems
- alcohol, smoking or drug abuse
- avoiding people

If you are experiencing any of these signs of stress or just not feeling yourself, you need to speak with someone - parents, family doctor, psychologist. Don't try to manage excess stress by yourself.






The young people were given the opportunity to reflect on what they wish they had known when they were at school. Their advice may help you better prepare for life after school. Click here to read about some of their thoughts including:

Census date at Uni - important information if you are not happy at Uni

Census date is the date in which your enrolment and fee arrangements/responsibilities are considered finalised for the study period. Census date is the last date you can drop a course/subject/s without receiving a financial or academic penalty. Each university has their individual policies, and you can find them by simply googling 'Census Date + Universities'. If you are wanting to leave or defer a course/degree, make sure you talk with Student Services BEFORE census date.

Student One - Brisbane Student Accommodation


Student One knows that when deciding where to live, it's important to consider more than just your place of study. You're choosing your new home, so your surroundings, cost of living, work life, and social life should all be considered. Their location in Brisbane's central business district puts you just a short walk away from major universities, shopping centres, entertainment and nightlife. With easy access to all that Brisbane has to offer, you can explore the city and get where you need to go quickly.

The five most common university myths debunked

There are popular myths about university study some of which are:







First year Uni doesn't count – False. At most universities, first year results contribute to your final grade point average (GPA). Your GPA is of interest to future employers. Furthermore, your first year GPA (if good enough) can be used to be competitive for entry to your preferred course if you didn't get straight into it from school. You can apply for scholarships once you get to Uni and your GPA is important when applying for these scholarships.

I'll be paying off my HECS-HELP debt for the rest of my life – False. The HECS-HELP loan scheme helps you pay your part of the cost of the course you are studying (called 'Student contribution'). You begin paying it through the Australian Tax Office as part of your income tax once you have completed your course and are earning a threshold amount (\$51,550 from 1 July 2023). You don't pay interest on your debt, but it is indexed each year to reflect changes in the Consumer Price Index. I'll never find a job after graduation — Competition for jobs is high. However, you can increase your employability while you are studying by gaining work experience in the field in which you want to work. This not only looks good on your resume, but it also gives employers a chance to see what sort of worker you are. Don't wait until your final year at uni to start looking for jobs. Access the uni Careers and Employment services and programs early during your studies.

If I don't make friends during O Week, I never will – For those who don't know, O Week is Orientation Week which is usually the week before lectures begin. This is an important week as the information you receive will introduce you to the support services and other activities available. You will have many additional opportunities to make friends during your Uni studies. If you're not particularly comfortable starting up a conversation with a random in class, get involved in a university club or two.

Lectures can be skipped – Yes and No. Lectures are usually recorded and made available online, so technically, you don't need to attend in person. However, there is good reasons why you should go to every class. Attendance might form part of a percentage of your final mark. You're paying to sit in that lecture theatre, so you might as well show up and enjoy it. Lectures provide an opportunity to make new friends and of course, impress a lecturer or two. Lecturers are great contacts for future employment.

Year 12 Early Offer Scheme—reminder to change preferences

The <u>Year 12 Early Offer Scheme</u> can provide you with an offer to study at QUT before receiving your ATAR or IB Diploma. To receive an invitation to apply to the scheme, you need to complete your QTAC application by 20 October, listing a QUT eligible course as one of your top three preferences. After receiving an invitation and uploading your supporting document, if you are approved you will receive email notification on Thursday 9 November. You then have until Tuesday 14 November to make sure an eligible course is listed as your first preference. Concurrent diplomas

<u>A concurrent diploma</u> is a diploma-level qualification (<u>AQF 5</u>) that you can study alongside your bachelor's program. All diplomas are made up of 16 units and you can spread these units across the duration of your bachelor's program, or you can complete these units in a concentrated period. You can apply to add the <u>Diploma in Languages</u> as a concurrent diploma. You apply to add a concurrent diploma once you are enrolled in your Bachelor program.

UQ College Prerequisite Intensive Courses

UQ College is offering intensive short courses over 4 weeks for students to obtain a prerequisite in Mathematical Methods, Physics, Biology or Chemistry. Successful completion will satisfy prerequisite requirements at UQ (check with other universities to see if they accept these courses for their prerequisites) and results will be ready for the January 2024 QTAC Offer Round. Entry requirements include:

- Completion of High School Year 11 in Australia, or competencies that demonstrate equivalence at a comparable level.
- Students wanting to study Biology, Chemistry or Physics are required to have undertaken at least one year of science in their senior high school studies. Likewise, students seeking entry into Mathematical Methods are required to have undertaken at least one year of a maths subject in their senior high school studies.


