Why study Hospitality?

How is student work assessed in Hospitality?

Various assessment techniques are employed, including practical observations, project and assignment work and role plays to measure student performance and to determine student competence for each of the units of competency in the course. There will be multiple opportunities for the students to provide evidence and demonstrate they have attained the required knowledge and skills.
